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

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Antitrust Issues in our Health Insurance **Industry Are Real**

There are systemic issues in the delivery of health insurance that employers provide to their most valuable resource, their employees. Most employees are reliant on the benefit option plans being offered by his or her company, which is the most affordable way to elect into health benefits.

Many of you reading this have recently received notification that Blue Cross Blue Shield (BCBS) is in the process of settling a 2020 antitrust litigation for \$2.7 billion. BCBS was accused of restricting competition by limiting how its member companies competed against each other. The complaint is that BCBS used its structure to suppress competition and keep premiums artificially high

I always like to remind everyone that since 1985, United Healthcare's stock price has been up 200,000%. The good news—insert tongue in cheek—is that BCBS is a "nonprofit, not for profit" health insurance provider.

There are only two other health insurance companies remaining, CIGNA and Aetna, which are now a part of CVS Health. Humana stopped writing commercial health insurance in 2023. Currently, there are now only four carriers offering their respective health networks.

Back to antitrust, in 2017, the federal courts blocked mergers of Aetna-Humana as well as BCBS-CIGNA. Both mergers were deemed anti-competitive.


There are many issues that keep us at Providence Benefit Solutions (PBS) on our toes, working on behalf of our employer groups and their employees. We are constantly looking for ways to beat the "4 Horsemen" at their collective game. It is not easy, but we can and do win for our clients.

We can quote health insurance for any company for January 1st as well as June 1st effective dates. The difference is that June will have a 6% higher premium. The carriers call this "trend increase". As far as PBS is aware, there is no other industry that sets its price increase at 12% annually. This practice has been going on for decades.

Let me give you a real example of a local Tampa Heating and Air Conditioning company with 60 employees. They had been with United for 15 straight years. We requested the opportunity to compete for the business. Their rates were absurdly too high, and the benefits were a watered-down mess that barely qualified as health coverage. We delivered a 40% rate reduction with better, more comprehensive plans from Aetna. Their broker at the time was left to scramble and went to United's other division and received a rate match - a 40% reduction.

Aetna now understood that United knew the risk, thus lowered the rates another 10% for a total of 50% decease. Carriers like United previously considered this cannibalizing their own block of business. HOWEVER, recall that there is that pesky BCBS \$2.7 billion settlement paving the way for some real religion by United and other carriers.

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Carrying on the Legacy of Cigar City:

Meet Lliana Fuente and Manuel Garcia

bor City is synonymous with Cigar City, thanks in large part to savvy entrepreneurs like Artuo Fuente. After immigrating from Güines, Cuba due to the Spanish-American War, he ended up in West Tampa and at 24 years old, he launched the Arturo Fuente cigar brand in 1912. Since then, the business has been passed down from generation to generation.

Today, you can still purchase Arturo Fuente cigars from local cigar shops in Ybor like Tabanero Cigars and Sweetheart Cigars, and his great-granddaughter, Liana

Fuente, is proudly carrying on the family tradition with her husband, Manuel "Manny" Garcia.

"Legacy is a beautiful yet intimidating word because it describes something to be honored and remembered," says Liana. "Yet, it places a lot of stress and expectations on those who must carry it on. I, for one, am very

grateful for my family story, which is the story of the American Dream. We live in the greatest country in the world, where the Fuente story was written with so much love, passion, and sacrifice.

"Yes, it can be challenging working in a family business, but the reward of continuing in the footsteps of those who came before you, carrying on their values and dreams, definitely outweighs any negative components," she continues. "It is definitely a privilege to be involved in our family business and industry, and to be able to honor someone like my grandfather Carlos A. Fuente, my hero."

She has spent over 15 years at the cigar brand, working her way up to the Vice President of Brand Development



role under the tutelage of her grandfather, who taught her "the importance of keeping your word, living with integrity, and putting family first." While she has recently

> stepped away from her day-to-day role at the company, she still serves on the board with Manny and she is currently in the process of restoring Arturo Cigar Factory. It is the oldest standing Arturo Fuente Cigar Factory, located on 18th Street and a short walk away from the J.C. Newman Cigar Factory.

"As I restore the oldest Arturo Fuente factory located in northern Ybor City, I continue to keep in mind our past and traditions but also think about what

> I can do to keep Tampa moving forward. We really appreciate all the projects going up, especially those that restore or replicate Tampa's history, and not just tear down for the sake of having new buildings," says Liana passionately. "There is a lot of work ahead to make sure we don't lose the essence of Tampa - that town with southern charm, Latin flavor, and sunny weather - but to also embrace the future and grow strategically for all residents."

With the old factory being over 100 years old, it's been a process, to say

the least, but 110% worth it to preserve both a vital part of her family's and Tampa's history. Liana has felt like she has grown personally from this process and has a



newfound respect for "individuals' ingenuity of those that came before us to build this piece of history." Manny has always been Liana's number-one supporter throughout this project. He has been serving as the Vice President of Operations and General Counsel for Arturo Fuente since 2020. Prior to that, he was Florida Counsel for the New York Yankees.

"I have been lucky enough to work for two family-owned businesses, two great global brands in two wonderful and fun industries, and to be able to be part of amazing teams of people who are passionate and hardworking," shares Manny. "I have been very lucky, as a Cuban-American kid from West Tampa, to have been able to experience and see so much in my career - from the opening of the new Yankee Stadium and winning the 2009 World Series Championship to numerous cigar and company of the year awards and the restoration of the oldest Arturo Fuente cigar factory. I have been, and am, truly blessed."

The couple have been living in Sunset Park since April of 2012 and have formed a close-knit community with their neighbors. They took Liana's grandfather's advice about

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investing in prosperity, so when the opportunity arose, Liana jumped at it.


"Our kitchen is where the party is. Whether it's making coffee in the morning, or prepping doggie treats, or getting ready for dinner, the music is always on, dancing takes center stage, and happiness radiates throughout the house," says Manny. "Sometimes, it's the simple things in life that bring the most joy, and our home truly provides the place for that."

"As they say the kitchen is where the heart of the home is, every morning we make Cuban coffee together, talk about current events, and dance to music to start our day," agrees Liana and adds on, "[Plus,] one of our favorite spots as well as our side yards. One side yard is for the adults, and on the other side, we laid turf from our actual wedding for the pups to enjoy while we are outside smoking a cigar with them."

They have had 11 dogs over their marriage and currently have five fur babies that are Boston Terriers and Frenchies: Bella, Bruce, Bruno, Scrappy, and Rosie. Their home is cleverly nicknamed "The Fuente Dog Pound" due to all of their rescues that they very dearly. Liana herself is a self-proclaimed animal lover and has had chickens, birds, and cats in addition to dogs; she would love to add a baby goat or pig to their four-legged family, but Manny is a bit

weary of that venture! Throughout the past 17 years, she has volunteered at the Humaine Society and has helped raise nearly \$750,000 for them as well as another cause close to her heart, breast cancer research.

In fact, they had a Boston Terrier as their flower girl at their wedding. Their wedding was nothing short of a spectacular event, with a "showstopping couture wedding dress," two Grammy award-winning artists performing at their reception, and over 1,000 guests. The church service took place at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in West Tampa and the wedding reception took place in Ybor City, across the street from the historic cigar factory that houses the corporate offices for the Arturo Fuente Cigar Company.

"These areas have a historical connection to Cuba, the immigrant experience, the cigar industry, and the American Dream," says Liana. "Honestly, the wedding was one of the best days of my life. People flew from all over the United States to be there for us. I had all my friends and family there. It was a true blessing; everyone was having so much fun and truly enjoyed our wedding with us. It was a night to remember. One of my favorite moments of the wedding was all the dancing. We had Grammy award winner Willy Chirino and dear friend Arturo Sandoval performing, and there was not a single person

What sets Arturo Fuente apart from other cigar brands?

"One of our longtime values at Arturo Fuente, which has become a well-known slogan of ours but still holds true as a core principle, is that 'We will never rush the hands of time.' Basically, we never sacrifice our commitment to quality or our core beliefs as a family business for a quick buck. We don't follow the crowd, we don't chase trends, and we don't do gimmicks. 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
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The Rays 2025 Season has a whole new look, new stadium, new players, and maybe...a new local owner.

As the sun rises on the 2025 MLB season, there are Rays of hope and change on the horizon! The Rays will play in Tampa for the entire season outdoors at Steinbrenner Field, the Spring home of the New York Yankees. When the roof blew off Tropicana Field in Hurricane Milton, Tampa was clearly the best choice for many reasons. The location was perfect and way better than Tropicana Field. The clubhouse and ancillary facilities are Major League quality.

It only seats around 11,500, and the summer months will bring afternoon thunderstorms (the Tarpons only averaged 6 rainouts), but the response has been overwhelmingly positive. The premium seats cost up to 30K for a season ticket, and they sold out quickly. The rest of the tickets are nearly sold out, some at double and triple the price of Tropicana Field, where the Rays averaged just over 16K fans last year. With the significantly higher prices, the Rays will likely make more revenue in ticket sales than they did in St. Pete. It's going to be a tough and expensive ticket.

On the field, the Rays will likely have more than half the roster turned over from the opening day of 2024. New additions include former Padres Gold Glove SS Ha-Seong Kim, who will be a huge upgrade offensively. Veteran

most exciting player of Spring has been 21-year-old 3B Junior Caminero, who played in 43 games last year and hit 6 HRs. He's had a huge offseason in the Dominican Winter League (hitting the game-winning HR in game 7 of the championship series), and many experts believe he can be a consistent 30+ Home Run guy, something the Rays have rarely had in their lineup.

The pitching staff figures to be one of the best in baseball,

Catcher Danny Jansen has wowed the Rays staff with his

leadership, power, and defense in spring. But perhaps the

The pitching staff figures to be one of the best in baseball, with 6 legitimate starters vying for 5 slots. All-Star starter Shane McClanahan returns from Tommy John surgery and looked great in the spring. Ryan Pepiot, Zach Littell, Shane Baz, Drew Rasmussen, and Taj Bradley all have top-of-the-rotation stuff! This will keep the Rays in almost every game they play. The Bullpen returns with superb closer Pete Fairbanks and a stable of guys who can all throw 98! Edwin Uceta was sensational at the end of last season. Manuel Rodriguez, Kevin Kelly, and Garrett Cleavinger all return after excellent seasons. Many experts believe the entire staff is among the top 5 in baseball.



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The Rays offense is the biggest question mark. They finished second-to-last in almost every category last vear. Only the historically bad White Sox were worse. Other than Kim and Jansen-offensive upgrades but hardly sluggers-the notoriously cheap Rays spent next to nothing to upgrade the offense. They are banking on the young Caminero to provide pop, along with Josh Lowe (great 2023, terrible 2024) and Brandon Lowe returning to previous form. Jonathan Aranda and Yandy Diaz (former batting champ, limited power) also need to step up. GM Eric Neander admitted he's hoping to get to an "average" offense, and with this elite pitching staff, it might be enough to return to the post-season.

Off the field, the stadium saga continues to be evil the team once known as the Devil Rays. As of this writing, it appears owner Stu Sternberg will renege on the deal he signed with St Petersburg and declared the Rays were "Here to Stay". The good news is that my well-placed sources within the negotiations tell me 2 groups based in Tampa are vying to buy the Rays. One group I would refer to as "Elite" and well-known businessmen. MLB Commissioner Rob Manfred is aware of these groups and has given them his blessing. He has repeated multiple times that the league has no intentions of leaving the Tampa Bay market, saying MLB LOVES the market.

My sources tell me both groups would prefer to build a stadium on the Tampa side, which has always been the preference of MLB. It's important to remember that Stu Sternberg CANNOT, under league rules, unilaterally sell the team and move them. It takes a 3/3 vote of owners to move a team, and MLB says that is extremely unlikely. My reporting has also been confirmed by the highly respected Ken Rosenthal of the Athletic and Fox Sports. It's my educated guess that the Rays will be sold to local ownership and a new stadium announced on the Tampa side within the next year.

So, big changes are happening for the Rays! This is a good thing. Players mentioned this Spring that the vibe in the clubhouse for the last 2 years has not been good and

needed to change. An ownership change would likely mean more spending on players and keeping players long-term instead of Sternberg's preference to sell them off when their contracts got too big.

Imagine, the Rays playing in front of a packed stadium every night in Tampa and winning big! I expect that to happen this year and many years to come! The Sun is rising on the Rays in Tampa!



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
